

2. PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THE PROPERTY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY UNDER VALUATION

This opinion on valuation is prepared for a residential property situated at the aforesaid address. As per the copy of sale deed, the subject property is constructed over a land area admeasuring 1 Cottah 9 Chittaks 15 sq. ft./ 126.66 sq. yds./ 1,140 sq. ft.

As per the observations made during the site survey, the subject property comprises a G + 2 floor RCC structure. The ground floor consists of garage and godown. The first floor consists of 2 bedrooms, 2 toilets, a kitchen and a balcony. The second floor consists of 2 Bedrooms, 2 toilets, a kitchen, a store room and a balcony. The terrace consists of a bedroom, a kitchen, a bathroom, a store room and a prayer room.

We have not been provided with the sanctioned building plan of the subject property, therefore, all the measurements of the building has been taken physically by measurement tools during the site visit. The same was found be beyond the permissible limits. Therefore, we have referred the building bye laws and the built-up area within the permissible limits comes out to be 2,280 sq. ft. and the same has been considered fair and reasonable for the purpose of this valuation. Further, it was informed that the subject property is around 25 years old.

Remuneration and Costs.

- 27. A valuer shall provide services for remuneration which is charged in a transparent manner, is a reasonable reflection of the work necessarily and properly undertaken, and is not inconsistent with the applicable rules.


