This valuation report is prepared for commercial showroom situated at the aforesaid address having total land area measuring 1114.84 sq. mtr. / 12000.14 sq. ft as documents provided to us by the bank.

This is a Lease hold land with 99 years lease rights, purchased by the virtue of Transfer deed dated May 04, 2011 by the present owner M/S. Shakumbari Automobiles Pvt. Ltd. from M/s Kamal Plastic & Rubber Industries through its Partner /Manager Shri Ram Lal s/o Shri Narayan Das. The subject property is a landmark. The subject property is located in Sitabpur industrial area. The owner has constructed RCC & Shed blocks structures in which RCC block is used for Maruti Suzuki Arena Showroom, Office, Scrap Godown, Store Room, Workshop area, Body shop area and Entire Shed blocks is used as Body shop area.

As approved map is not provided and the actual site measurements is almost 100% of plot area but as per building bylaws permissible FAR is 1.50 with ground coverage 55% attached as annexure below. According to building bye laws the total built up area at GF is 6600 sqft. and Basement area is 1800 Sqft. therefore, total builtup area is 8400.00 sqft and same is considered for this assessment.

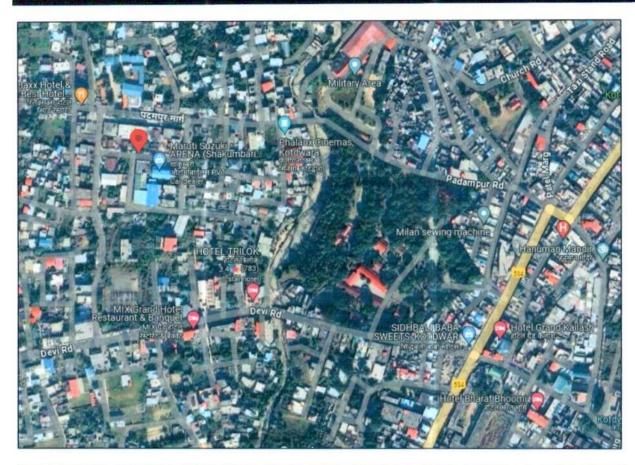
