2. PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THE PROPERTY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY UNDER VALUATION

This valuation report is prepared for the Industrial property situated at the aforesaid address. As the subject property is purchased through 3 multiple deeds with cumulative land area of 48.05 kanals/~6acres but as per CLU document the land area of 20,276.27 is converted for setting up of warehouse for storage of agro produce only, therefore the land area as per CLU is considered as industrial and remaining ~ 1acre of agricultural land is not identified and demarcated hence area of 4030.15 Sq.m. is considered as agriculture in nature and cannot be sold separately.

Neither the approved map nor any building sheet of the subject property is provided but as per occupancy certificate the total builtup area is 5287.198 Sq.m. but during site visit 2 more shed structures are constructed which is not mentioned in occupancy certificate. Therefore, total builtup area of 6720.12 Sq.m. is considered for this Assessment.

This industrial plant is for food processing and during site survey it was found not operational, vacant and locked. The plant is non-operational since July-2024. The subject property named as Mubarak overseas as mentioned on the main gate.

The subject property is situated in the revenue state of village Murthal Tehsil Sonipat, Haryana. It is located at a distance of approx. 4.5 Km from GT road and connects via Tajpur – Murthal Rd. and Mehandipur Rd. It is a standalone industrial property in the locality and all neighboring properties are agricultural in nature.

In case of discrepancy in the address mentioned in the property documents and the property shown to us at the site due to change in zoning or administrative level at the site or client misled the valuer by providing the fabricated document, the valuation should be considered of the property shown to us at the site of which the photographs are also attached. Our responsibility will be only related to the valuation of the property shown to

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us on the site and not regarding matching from the documents or searching the property from our own. In case required, Bank may further engage district administration/ tehsil level to verify the identification of the property if it is the same matching with the document pledged.
